Hey you,

What are the first words that come to your mind when you read the word "Grace"? Is it words like undeserving, unmerited or

you start dropping heavy duty words like regeneration, sanctification, charis, etc., or are you in the category of automatically singing "Amazing Grace"!! Well if you did that then congrats we are on the same page. Well, I am sure you must have read a lot about grace in the Bible, hear it from the pulpit and social media. It is stated that the word "Grace" is one of the foundations of our faith. But have you ever thought about how to describe grace in your own words? How would you explain that to someone curious about your Christian faith? How would you answer their questions? What is the spiritual meaning of grace? What does "Grace upon Grace" mean in the Bible?

Well the reason I am exercising your mind to think is because there have been multiple occasions where I have observed the word Grace being misused and misunderstood or simply being replaced by other vocabularies. Sometimes people emphasize grace in one area of faith but not in others, whereas in other times they use it interchangeably with words like patience or forbearance. But the definition that concerns me the most is overlooking something (i.e sin). As in, "This is who I am, and God accepts me that way. He gives me Grace to be myself." and the other extreme like. "I have failed God so often, I don't think I am worthy of His Grace." Along all this lines the word 'but' comes around as God's Grace is bigger, greater, deeper, and more amazing than many people realize. So it is really important that we understand the grace of the Bible, so that when we hear people talk about it or share about it. we know what they are talking about. Because believing in a grace that is different from the Bible is not only misleading but also dangerous for our faith.

So come on, let's leave all the fancy language at the door-step and keep things as simple as possible when talking about the meaning of Grace according to the Bible and how to interpret phrases like "Grace upon Grace." Come along.

Let's dig in, shall we?

What Is the Spiritual meaning of Grace?

Simply putting it, Grace is when God gives us goodness that we do not deserve. The best and most powerful example of grace is the gift of eternal life.

We don't deserve it.

We can't earn it.

But because God loves us so deeply, He made it possible for us to have what we don't deserve; eternal life with Him and We call it salvation.

Paul describes it in the Bible like this, "But God, being rich in mercy, because of His great love with which He loved us, even when we were dead in our wrongdoings, made us alive together with Christ (by grace you have been saved)" Ephesians 2:4-5 NIV

"For by grace you have been saved through faith; and this is not of yourselves, it is the gift of God; not a result of works, so that no one may boast" Ephesians 2:8-9 NIV





What Does Grace for Grace mean in the Bible?

The term "Grace for Grace or Grace upon Grace" comes from a verse in **John chapter I**. In this portion of John, He is describing who Jesus is, His reason for coming to earth and what we gain as recipients of Jesus' love. John writes,

"And the Word became flesh, and dwelt among us; and we saw His glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth. John testified about Him and called out, saying, "This was He of whom I said, 'He who is coming after me has proved to be my superior, because He existed before me.'" For of His fullness we have all received, and grace upon grace.

John 1:14-16

Grace upon Grace is another way of describing an abundance of grace; even ongoing grace.

See God deals in grace much differently than we do. Maybe it's because He sees the bigger picture of what grace is supposed to accomplish.

People see grace as something that is given freely once and only given again if our performance merits it.

But God on the other gives us grace based on how deeply He loves us. It's an ongoing expression of God's love and commitment to people; despite our sin and wrongdoing. Some believe that sin disqualifies us from receiving God's grace. The Bible actually teaches the opposite. When we sin, if we come to God with repentant hearts, He will meet us with abundant grace every single time.

This verse describes it best,

"...where sin increased, grace abounded all the more, so that, as sin reigned in death, so also grace would reign through righteousness to eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord".

Romans 5:20-21

When we're truly repentant, nothing can separate us from God. Grace wins every time and it is incredible to know how perfectly God loves us.

His mercies renew every morning.

And His love never fails.

Grace is defined as the unmerited gift from God based on His unconditional love for us.

Grace is God's gift to us that is continually transforming us into His image. And we have been given permission through the sacrificial gift of Christ to confidently approach His throne and seek His grace.

"Let us therefore draw near with confidence to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and may find grace to help in time of need". (Hebrews 4:16).





Growing in faith and believing in fate are two very different things which should be distinguish and understood. According to Oxford dictionary FATE is "the things, especially bad things, that will happen or have happened to someone or something "whereas FAITH is "trust in somebody's ability or knowledge; trust that somebody/something will do what has been promised". As Christians our faith does not rest upon any individual but it is in the Lord. Hebrews 11:1 " Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for , the conviction of things not seen".

FATE is believing that certain situations takes place because it was meant to take place and that humans have no control over it. I believe that believing in FATE makes us more like a nominal Christian where we just follow some rules and move according to circumstances. It will not be wrong to point out that many a time we tend to relate or assume that our circumstances, situations, chances, effects, outcomes, issues etc have been brought upon by our FATE. Faith is taking the step even when we don't see the whole staircase, believing and allowing God to come into our life and letting Him to take control.

Spending time with God ,prayers and reading His Word will help us grow in our faith. we should all practice our faith every-time be it at work, gathering, school or home, etc, because remember you are an ambassador for Christ. Faith and not fate should be the relationship we have with Christ. Hebrews 11:6

"It is impossible to please God without faith. Anyone who wants to come to Him must believe that God exists and that He rewards those who sincerely seek Him..."



Ever thought that you are just repeating a vicious cycle of human evolution, a mere existence of monotonous life where, "All the

world's a stage, and all the men and women merely players" as Shakespeare wrote. With numbers adding to our age, seldom do we learn to de-clutter and with every phase of our life, our baggage's grow and the compartments are filled with questions of existential crisis and unsettled disputes with ourselves and others which includes: childhood traumas, anxieties, low selfesteem, failures and shame, and in-between we juggle through worldly comforts and living a Christian life. How do we let ourselves loose from this amalgamation, turning us into a string puppet?

Francis Bacon in his essay, "Of Youth and Age" writes "A man that is young in years maybe old in hours if he has lost no time" this implies that, a man, who is best at his youth may possessed a mature mind if he spends all his time in acquiring knowledge and experience but alas! Are you able to understand the full concept of a community of believers? The narration of a community of believers can be seen in the book of The Acts (Acts 2:43). So can it be applied to the whole world? Or perhaps to the little Naga Community after all Nagaland is a Christian State, right? It may probably not even making up even 2% of Indian

Population. So as a Community what role does Nagaland play in Nation building or perhaps Peace building? Why did God create humankind in the first place? All these questions and more linger but we ought to understand His intention; which was to build a relationship between His creation and Himself, for all His perfect creation to come together in unity as one body and worship him (1 Corinthians 12:12-26). When Noah landed on dry ground after the forty days of rain, God called him and all that was in the ship with him to come and worship Him. God through Abraham choose a nation for Himself, a nation to call His own people and solely to build a relationship based on worship. And all he required His people to be obedient and surrender to Him in all ways. Thus, the stories that follows afterward inMY JOURNEY WITH KABA YOUTH.docx a way or another orbit around the same thing.

Selflessness was one big part of the first community of believers as observed in The Acts (Acts 2:43). Imagine the Naga first converts, in a very hostile environment where headhunting was normal and Christianity was considered an alien invasion. The new coverts would certainly be considered the ones who were brainwashed and the odd one out in the community. Now, imagine them alienated or shunned by the whole community. Who would despite the threat, show them kindness and acceptance? With that scenario in mind, imagine a handful of coverts meeting secretly at each other's homes, sharing and loving each other in agape love. That is the same old community of believers as in The Acts. Christians all over the world are under many threats because both believers and non-believers unfortunately do not understand what it really means to be a Christian. The few that do understand are under threat or are dying, not necessarily in flesh but in spirit because like Jesus who was persecuted by his own people, the community is divided by nepotism, tribalism, class and jealousy—the mother of all evil, and this community thrives by mentally demoralizing people. What if Nagaland as a community adopts the original community of believers as in The Acts? Where people would not fight over landownership, neighbors would share the mangoes grown in the middle of the fencing dividing two households? What if one Sunday morning the Newspaper report would show a NPSC result and the old man or neighboring aunty would not look at which tribe topped the list or which tribe got the highest number of post? What if the Government employee with power would consider each tribe his own and be vigilant and patriotic for the whole State? In the community of believers one should be a Good Samaritan and not the passing Levite or the Priest.

One big concern of Nagaland today is presumably the Youths. Youth make up most of the population in the Naga society. One would think that all the drug addicts, alcoholics, and all the so called "lost" cases are mere undisciplined, western or social media influenced wannabes but we the people are underestimating the power of a corrupted community. All these slowly dying Naga youths are mere byproducts and victims of the society. Talking about mental illness; how many of us take this issues seriously? Unemployment, divorced parents, abusive parents, financial problem, and many down the list undoubtedly leads to people running for temporary peace and relief. Mental illness cannot be downplayed; it requires a lot of support from fellow friends and family including the society. How many have shown a drug addict or an alcoholic unconditional love? In most cases the society would shun them, even to the point of a parent disowning the child. Individually one would agree that each person needs at least one person as a companion to keep one from going insane, because as John Donne says "No Man is an Island". Is it really impractical to imagine a loving community of believers? Where selflessness, generosity, and togetherness runs deep and it is each person's sole principle.


Is it quite not right to keep on continuing the same old habits? If the works of yesterday does not produce good fruits, today should be a wiser day because tomorrow needs saving. Nagaland is currently transitioning slowly from a headhunting community to a wayward community. Before there was headhunting practices but today people murder for money, vengeance, political conflicts, and so on. The difference is that people today do wrong to people with the Christian tag which means they actually know what they're doing is wrong but act anyway. Today, a handful few will voice out their concerns over the economic, political, ethical and spiritual state of the community. So will you at that time be a Good Samaritan or be a Levite or a Priest? Decide and do not fret over literary or customary concerns and for once think about what is right in the sight of God. And a Community of believers that live by Jesus Christ footsteps do not thrive on selfish gains and disunity.

THE KINGDOM'S PERSPECTIVE ON LIFE:

\(\text{There are so many cultural ideas these days that appears harmless or innocent on the surface. However, when one digs deeper, we see that some of these notions actually contradict God's word which drives us further from Jesus, as the modern world teaches us to be selfish (centred around me and me alone). One such idea is the philosophy of "SELF-LOVE" that serves as a therapy for modern lifestyle. This new age movement can be seen ramping across cultures seducing so many unsuspecting Christians into its fold.

Articles based on "the importance of self-love, the benefits of self-love, finding your value and purpose and how to treat yourself well?" Are some of the most searched topics online and it is only a click away. In addition, the internet is drenched with quotes and sayings that further advocate this idea of putting oneself first. For instance, "Love yourself first and everything else falls in line", "You really have to love yourself to get anything done in this world", "Taking care of yourself should be a priority", "It's not selfish to love yourself, take care of yourself and to make your happiness a priority", "Love yourself more, and then you'll be able to love others more effectively". While it remains an undisputed fact that the world is very self-centred and we live in a very selfconsuming society. But yet again the world today is more bent on propagating a "self-focussed" perspective on life, by teaching and promoting the idea of "self-love".

So the question arises what is self-love movement? What is it even saying?

Well the answer will be that "self-love movement" is a philosophy that teaches us to selfprioritize by putting ourselves first be it in wellbeing, happiness, comfort or needs, both for our own good and for the good of others. This movement frequently justifies its stand by quoting the following words "If you can't love yourself first, how can you love other people?" In addition modern psychology attributes many personal and social problems to an individual's lack of self-love and thus promotes awareness on ideas of "self-love, self-esteem, self-focussed, self-care and so on." Thus it is not surprising to see that self-love has become such a cultural buzzword and oftentimes it is offered as an empowering solution to the struggles and insecurities in life. It is particularly influential with the growth of mental-health awareness and its significance in the present scenario. Personally, I admit that it can be hard to wrap our heads around this issue when the entire world persistently propagates and teaches us to love ourselves wrapped under the covers of mental and emotional wellbeing.

The philosophy of self-love and many other similar ideologies are being wide spread and it is subconsciously creeping into our minds and it is sadly gaining popularity even among the Christians. So the question arises, why do I think it's sad that we the Christians are being swept into this cultural wave of self-love? The reason lies in the folds of the virtue of the Scripture that

ironically teaches Christians a completely opposite aspect as "The Kingdom's" prospect on one's life is to focus on others. Thus the Christian prospect of life is therefore the "selfless" perspective and not the other way round. Thus unlike what the Scripture says, the philosophy of self-love hinges on to the belief that we cannot adequately give love until we first love ourselves. If we were to bring it down, it basically means, "If I have enough of self-love within me, I get to share it with the people around me." But the problem with this kind of assumption from a Christian perspective is that it is clearly mentioned that we are not the source of love as a matter of fact "God is love and love comes from God!"

So what does it mean? Does it signify that humans are incapable of love? Of course not! Humans are capable of loving others and that is made possible only because we are created in the image and likeness of God (who is love). We are not love by nature and it does not come from us because we are not God. We are humans, sinful and selfish by nature and we need not be taught to prioritize ourselves, be selfish since by default we already are. Thus, when humans who are sinful in nature makes oneself the reference point for love the meaning of love completely changes from what God intended it to be. Moreover if everyone started putting them-selves first the world would most probably be chaotic so the only solution to our human selfishness is love and divine selflessness i.e, the love that comes from God which is self giving and pure.

It is this kind of selfless-love that God epitomized throughout the Scripture which characterises God Himself. It is a self-giving love not self-love or self-absorbed love. For it was in this selfless love that "God the Father, sent His one and only begotten son to die for our sins, that we may have everlasting life" (John 3:16). This idea of self-less love and other-focused perspective on life has also been beautifully portrait by Jesus (the Son) who in

will-full obedience, manifested the greatest degree of selflessness when He sacrificed His own life on the cross for the sake of the entire world (Isaiah 53:5; 1 Peter 2:24; Romans 5:8; 11 Corinthians 5:21; 1 John 2:2). Do you ever wonder what the fate of the entire world would be had Jesus also practiced the philosophy of self-love? What would have been the consequence for us and for the entire creation if Jesus had put up His interests, well-being or benefit first? Can you even begin to imagine what would have happened if Jesus considered the splendours more worthy than us?

You see, salvation was made possible only because Jesus was not thinking about Himself. He was thinking about you and me when He sacrificed His life on the cross, and both His prayers and actions shows that He did this. "Jesus came, not for His own benefit, but for ours". So, for those of us who now live under the Lordship of Christ the Bible commands us to imitate Christ (1 Corinthians 11:1; Ephesians 5:1-2; 1 John 2:6, Philippians 2:5) and this also requires us to imitate the selfless mind and heart of Christ. The Scripture teaches us not to look for our own interests or to prioritize ourselves but to follow in the footstep of Jesus, who taught and showed us what self-less love looks like.

That being said, some people have however, went on to Christianize this concept of self-love by often referring to the very famous commandment given by Jesus in the Gospels that states, "Love your neighbour as yourself "(Matthew 22:39; Mark 12:31), to imply "First love yourself, only then you'll be able to love your neighbours." Yet in so many other instances when talking about love, Jesus says, "to love is to lay down our lives for our friends (John 15:13) or if we are to be His disciples, we must deny ourselves, take up our cross and follow Him (Mark 8:34). So, does this mean that Jesus is teaching us two contradictory things about love at the same time? No. This is why reading the Scripture in its context is vital. When Jesus said, "Love your neighbours, as yourself," the emphasis is on "loving your neighbour" and not on "loving ourselves first." In this commandment, Jesus is not commanding self-love rather He is simply telling us that we ought to be concerned about the well-being and happiness of other people as you are about your own. In this Jesus basically tells us to love others and treat them like how you treat yourself.

In order to teach us how to love others Jesus commanded us to love God first, which is the first and greatest commandment. Only then did Jesus instructs us to love our neighbours which came as a follow-up to the greatest commandment because they are interconnected (Matthew

In order to teach us how to love others Jesus commanded us to love God first, which is the first and greatest commandment. Only then did Jesus instructs us to love our neighbours which came as a follow-up to the greatest commandment because they are interconnected (Matthew 22:36-40). Thus, it is only after we love God and our relationship is restored through Christ can one can be free from our self-centredness and given the ability to love others. Since God loves us, whoever has been born of God and knows Him are commanded to love other people in the same manner with zero expectations (1 John 4:7-21).

Thus, if we look at the philosophy of "self-love" in the light of these Scriptural arguments, one can understand that the entire idea of it is extremely dangerous to Christianity. It teaches us a very selfish where the path of value, worth and love is directed inwardly whereas Christianity looks outwardly towards God for value, worth, identity, authority and guidance given to us by God. Thus, while navigating such cultural trends, as Christians, let us be reminded that the Bible teaches us to be other-focused and not self-focused. Selflessness as a perspective to life as taught in the Scriptures and exemplified by Jesus is therefore not only counter to our current cultural tides but is also a central Christian character that believers are required to demonstrate. While easier said than done, I'm also aware that selflessness runs counter to human nature and being selfless is not an easy task as it is easier for humans to act selfishly than selflessly. However, the Bible does not leave us without solutions and it tells us that as much as faith is a gift from God, so is selflessness and love for others, fruits of the Spirit that the Holy Spirit works to develop in the lives of those who have accepted Christ and those who abides in Him (Galatians 5:22-23; John 15:4). For it is only through Him that our attitudes can be changed and moulded toward unselfish behaviours. And as we continue to go out into the world may our focus be outward just as the Bible teaches us demonstrating our love for God in our relationship and service to others in the same spirit and mind like Jesus. Let us be reminded, once again, that the Kingdom perspective on life is being "otherfocused and not self-focused, so that the entire perspective to living as Christian is the love. IMTICHILA JAMIR KABA - ABAM Missionary Mongolia since 2018

1) A brief description of the ministry you working at and about the specific area you work in?

I am involved in Youth and Evangelism ministry base at Mongolia International University. Since Mongolia is a closed country and we need a professional skill to get the visa, I work as an Assistant Professor in MIU and I reach out to students through Campus Ministry, Open Fellowship, Bible study and Home Fellowship.



2) How is the life style and culture there?

Mongolians overall live a more relaxed and care free life. They seem more individualistic and more open or accepting toward Western pop culture. Like many other countries around the world, Mongolia is a patriarchal society where men hold more power and privilege than women and education is highly valued in Mongolia.

3) What religion do they most follow?

Like Nagas they take great pride in their customs and way of life. The country's music, dance traditions are an important part of their cultural heritage. For instance, when you don't shake hand after you bump someone's foot accidentally or intentionally, that is considered taboo in Mongolia. Apologizing by words does not count and you must shake hand with the other person.

Buddhism is the main religion but the indigenous religion; Shamanistic elements were integrated into Mongolian Buddhism.



4) Callings works differently for all and so what was yours?

I was 2 years old, when I received a prophesy from a crusader during a Home Crusade Revival and it was that God has chosen me to serve in His mission. I used to tell my mom and dad that I want to go out of the country and work as a missionary teacher even when I did not have that much knowledge about what is mission and how do we go about it. At the age of 15 I was truly convicted with my calling to serve God and from that point there was no turning back.

5) What best helped you prepare you for mission?

Spiritual preparation for mission is the most important aspect of getting ready to go. It is essential to seek God's will and righteousness before anything and the best place for me to start it was by seeking God's direction in His word. Right after the completion of my secular studies I join a Discipleship training course in YWAM and later involved in Short Term Missionary and other training courses. Going out as missionary we also need to develop other skills like Agriculture, Business as Mission, Education, Medicine, Law, or Music which will be an instrumental to use it in a way that serves the people group you're ministering to. Preparing and equipping oneself is a continuous process and keeping that in mind, I am doing an online course in M.A Biblical Studies from SAICAS to be more effective in the mission.

6) Do people easily accept a new concept or idea in Mongolia?

Mongolia's readiness for change or the acceptance a new idea is slow and require a considerable amount of time. Mongolia is a very hard country when it comes to religion. For instance, to acquire a religious visa the law required religious groups to hire at least five local employees for each sponsored foreign worker, which makes it hard to get a visa for foreign missionaries to enter the country, so they ought to enter the country often under nonreligious visas (such as student, teacher, or business visas), which legally restricts us from conducting activities allowed under religious visas.

7) What differences or similarities do you see in the people at your work environment and the people here?

Naga as we come from the Mongoloid race somehow, I have observed so much of similarities. Like us Mongolians have a reputation for being frank, honest, hospitable, fun-loving, hardworking, self-reliant, gracious, curious, independent-minded and having a good sense of humour. Mongolia is a relationship-driven culture, so it is important to prepare ourselves to build relationships.

One take away from the Mongolian people; specially the youths is that, they take their own responsibility after entering the college. Almost all my students studying in MIU do part time job in the college café, office or in a restaurant or even go out of the country to America or South Korea during summer break so that they can save money for their college fees and hostel fee for the whole semester.

8) What message would you convey to the KABA youth?

"Be happy, young man, while you are young, and let your heart give you joy in the days of your youth. Follow the ways of your heart and whatever your eyes see, but know that for all these things God will bring you to judgment" (Ecclesiastes 11:9). And always remember, in whatever you do, always seek first His kingdom and His righteousness.






